Saint Joseph was the launching site for many of the western going pioneers. As such there were many interesting methods of travel used to go west. The following excerpt is from the November 10, 1866 edition of the Atchison Weekly Free Press:

Yesterday morning a party of emigrants passed through and created some excitement, owning to the very novel conveyance made use of. In a 'dog cart' leisurely reclining upon a mattress, were an old woman and a young girl, both enjoying the luxury of a pipe; the old man and his youthful son being hard at work giving the necessary locomotion to the vehicle.




Image of dog cart
